JARARVELLIR ARTILLERY BRUNCH

Sunday, May 20 at 11am

Please join us for the first Archers' barbecue of the season, starting at 11:00 a.m. in Hoyt Park. We'll provide the hot coals and condiments, bring a grillable item for yourself. We'll be ready to cook at 11:00. Feel free to provide something else for people to munch on, though it's not required. Please bring your own feastware since we don't provide dishes. At noon we will retire to the Stock Pavilion for archery practice. Loaner archery equipment is available. You are welcome to join us at one or both locations.

Directions to Hoyt Park:

FROM THE EAST--take your best route to Regent St. Head west on Regent, keep going past West High School and the cemeteries. Continue on Regent, it will take you into Hoyt Park. **TRISTAN PAY ATTENTION HERE:** Keep driving past the sign for the park and the parking lot for the large park shelter (on your right), continue down the street as it meanders along. Eventually the houses on the left give way to an expanse of lawn with picnic tables and stone fireplaces. On the right, the woods with picnic tables and stone fireplaces drop away and a scenic overlook with parking for several cars appears just before the road starts to meander downhill. Park there. Go across the street to the table with the SCA people sitting at a table with a tablecloth.

FROM THE WEST--take your best route to Midvale Blvd. Turn onto Hillcrest, located halfway between the Mineral Point and Regent intersections. Go several blocks on Hillcrest and turn left onto Owen Parkway (note that you will pass Owen Dr. along the way). The street sign is hard to see, but if you reach Westmoreland you went 1 block too far. Owen Parkway will take you up into Hoyt Park and turn into Regent St. Look for the lawn with stone BBQ's on your right and the scenic pullout on your left. You can park in the pullout, or continue down the street to a lot on your left as you leave the park.

It's Only A Flesh Wound! Event (Kristin): Proposing a fighting event on January 26th (to be called "It's Only a Flesh Wound!"). - May 19, 1536: Anne Boleyn, second wife of Henry VIII, is beheaded for adultery.
- 1568: Queen Elizabeth I of England has Mary Queen of Scots arrested.
- May 20, 1293: King Sancho IV of Castile creates the Study of General Schools of Alcalá.
- 1497: John Cabot sets sail from Bristol, England, on his ship The Mathew looking for a route to the west (other documents give a 2 May date).
- 1498: Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama arrives at Kozhikode (previously known as Calicut), India.
- 1521: Battle of Pampeluna.
- May 21, 1358: Jacquerie Uprising begins. The Jacquerie was a peasant revolt, so named from the habit of French nobles to refer to any peasant as "Jacque" or "Jacques Bonhomme." A series of injustices (including the pillaging of the countryside by unopposed English mercenaries) accumulated until the peasants exploded in righteous anger. The outbreak that began near Compiègne on this date spread rapidly through the countryside. Numerous castles were destroyed and the inhabitants killed. The country peasants joined forces with Parisian rebels, but all were defeated in June, whereupon many were slaughtered.
- May 22, 1455: First Battle of Saint Albans. The first battle of the Wars of the Roses, the Battle of Saint Albans occurred when Richard, Duke of York became convinced that the king's wife, Margaret of Anjou, was plotting his destruction with Edmund Beaufort, the Duke of Somerset. The brief skirmish, in which Richard Neville played a significant role, resulted in Somerset's death and the capture of King Henry VI, but York's ascendancy was short-lived, and Margaret regained control a year later.
- May 23, 1430: Joan of Arc captured by the Burgundians.
- 1568: Netherlands declared independence from Spain.
- 1568: Dutch rebels led by Louis of Nassau, brother of William I of Orange, defeat Jean de Ligne, Duke of Aremberg and his loyalist troops in the Battle of Heiligerlee, opening the Eighty Years' War.
- May 24, 1430: Joan of Arc is captured by the forces of the Duke of Burgundy.
- 1487: Imposter Lambert Simnel is crowned as "King Edward VI" at Dublin.
- 1595: The Nomenclator of Leiden University Library appears, the first printed catalog of an institutional library.
- May 25, 1659: Richard Cromwell resigns as Lord Protector of England following the restoration of the Long Parliament, beginning a second brief period of the republican government called the Commonwealth.
- May 26, 1328: William of Ockham, Franciscan Minister-General Michael of Cesena, and two other Franciscan leaders secretly leave Avignon, fearing a sentence of death from Pope John XXII.
- 1538: Geneva expels John Calvin and his followers from the city. Calvin lives in exile in Strasbourg for the next three years.
- May 27, 1328: King Philip VI of France crowned.
- May 28, 1588: The Spanish Armada, with 130 ships and 30,000 men, begins to set sail from Lisbon heading for the English Channel.
- May 29, 1167: Battle of Legano, in which The Lombard League defeats Emperor Frederick I.
- 1414: Council of Constance.
- May 30, 1431: In Rouen, France, 19-year-old Joan of Arc is burned at the stake.
- 1536: King Henry VIII of England marries Jane Seymour, a lady-in-waiting to his first two wives.
- 1539: In Florida, Hernando de Soto lands at Tampa Bay with 600 soldiers with the goal of finding gold.

THE ANTI-CALENDAR

(A listing of events that have already happened)

- May 1, 1328: Wars of Scottish Independence end: Treaty of Edinburgh-Northampton – England recognizes Scotland as an independent nation.
- 1576: Stephen Báthory crowned king of Poland. Stephen successfully defended Poland's eastern Baltic regions against Russian invasion, and attempted to form a great state from Poland, Muscovy, and Transylvania.
- May 2, 1568: Mary I of Scotland escapes from Loch Leven Castle.
- May 4, 1471: Battle of Tewkesbury. In England's Wars of the Roses, King Edward IV defeats the forces of Margaret of Anjou, killing Edward, Prince of Wales, consolidating his power and halting the wars until his premature death in 1483.
- May 7, 1429: Joan of Arc leads a French attack on English bridgeheads on the south side of the Loire River.
- 1274: In France, Second Council of Lyons opens to regulate election of the Pope.
- May 8, 1450: Jack Cade's Rebellion: Kentishmen revolt against King Henry VI.
- 1541: Hernando de Soto reaches the Mississippi River and names it Río de Espíritu Santo.
- May 10, 1503: Christopher Columbus visits the Cayman Islands and names them Las Tortugas after the numerous sea turtles there.
- 1534: Jacques Cartier visits Newfoundland.
- May 11, 1502: Christopher Columbus leaves for his fourth and final voyage to the West Indies.
- May 12, 1364: Jagiellonian University, the oldest university in Poland, was founded in Kraków, Poland.
- 1551: National University of San Marcos, the oldest university in the Americas, was founded in Lima, Peru.
- 1588: French Wars of Religion: Henry III of France flees Paris after Henry of Guise enters the city.
- May 13, 1568: Battle of Langside: the forces of Mary Queen of Scots are defeated by a confederacy of Scottish Protestants under James Stewart, Earl of Moray, her half-brother.
- May 14, 1264: Battle of Lewes: Henry III of England is captured in France making Simon de Montfort the de facto ruler of England.
- 1483: Coronation of Charles VIII of France ("Charles l'Affable").
- May 15, 1252: Pope Innocent IV issues the papal bull ad extirpanda, which authorizes the torture of heretics in the Medieval Inquisition. Torture quickly gains widespread usage across Catholic Europe.
- 1514: Jodocus Badius Ascensius publishes Christiern Pedersen's Latin version of Saxo's Gesta Danorum ("Deeds of the Danes"), the oldest known version of that work.
- May 16, 1532: Sir Thomas More resigns as Lord Chancellor of England.
- 1568: Mary Queen of Scots flees to England.
- May 17, 1521: Edward Stafford, 3rd Duke of Buckingham, is executed for treason.
- 1590: Anne of Denmark is crowned Queen of Scotland.
- May 18, 1268: The Principality of Antioch, a crusader state, falls to Mamluk Sultan Baibars in the Battle of Antioch; Baibars' destruction of the city of Antioch was so great as to permanently negate the city's importance.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Baronial Webminister — a warranted position that reports to the Kingdom Webminister, the Baronial Webminister maintains and supports the Baronial website, which can include the main site, as well as creating occasional event pages for Baronial and Canton activities and events. Please contact Robert the Stout if you are interested in the position.

Thrown Weapons Marshal — the Thrown Weapons Marshal is responsible for the safe set up and operation of the Barony's thrown weapon practices. The Marshal is also responsible for the Barony's thrown weapon equipment. You must either be a TW Marshal or MIT (or willing to become one) to hold this position. If interested, please contact John Bartholomew of Flanders (Jack) or Robert the Stout.

Deputy Knight Marshal — the Deputy Knight Marshal is responsible for assisting the Knight Marshal in overseeing fighting in the Barony. This includes running fight practices, and keeping records of the fighters in the Barony. You need to be either a Marshal or a Marshal in Training to hold this position. While a good Sheriff is certainly a boon to their barony, the service rendered by an evil Sheriff is unquestionably superior (albeit underappreciated). Our most high profile work lies in fighting and fencing demos for the public, wherein we play the heavies. Not that this is a burden, mind you- most any third-grader will madly cheer on Sheriff Sinister von Blacktunic over Sir Maxmillian Mirror-plate any day of the week, trust me! But our support for our kingdom doesn't end there. An evil Sheriff is ever mindful of his duty to ceaselessly harry, crush and humiliate those beneath his station. Why, if it wasn't for our efforts our inexperienced combatants would be robbed of the greater part of their incentive to train and better their skills. Lacking an evil sheriff to heap abuse upon their shoulders how would they achieve the focus necessary to improve their game? This is why you should be thankful for your evil Sheriff. It is also why you shall receive a swirlie when next we meet.
