Please join us for the last outdoor archers' barbecue of the season, starting at 11:00 a.m. in Hoyt Park. We'll provide the hot coals and condiments; bring a grillable item for yourself. We'll be ready to cook at 11:00. Feel free to provide something else for people to munch on, though it's not required. Please bring your own feastware since we don't provide dishes. At noon we will retire to the Stock Pavilion for archery practice. Loaner archery equipment is available. You are welcome to join us at one or both locations.

Directions to Hoyt Park:

FROM THE EAST--take your best route to Regent St. Head west on Regent, keep going past West High School and the cemeteries. Continue on Regent, it will take you into Hoyt Park. Keep driving past the sign for the park and the parking lot for the large park shelter (on your right), continue down the street as it meanders along. Eventually the houses on the left give way to an expanse of lawn with picnic tables and stone fireplaces. On the right, the woods with picnic tables and stone fireplaces drop away and a scenic overlook with parking for several cars appears just before the road starts to meander downhill. Park there. Go across the street to the table with the SCA people sitting at a table with a tablecloth.

FROM THE WEST--take your best route to Midvale Blvd. Turn onto Hillcrest, located halfway between the Mineral Point and Regent intersections. Go several blocks on Hillcrest and turn left onto Owen Parkway (note that you will pass Owen Dr. along the way). The street sign is hard to see, but if you reach Westmoreland you went 1 block too far. Owen Parkway will take you up into Hoyt Park and turn into Regent St. Look for the lawn with stone BBQ's on your right and the scenic pullout on your left. You can park in the pullout, or continue down the street to a lot on your left as you leave the park.

We should also encourage some of our membership to attend as well (focus on those with something to show off or share with potential new folks).

Chatelaine (Wren): Do we have the chatelaine materials in electronic format? I'd like to update the materials (some of which still refer to the Principality).

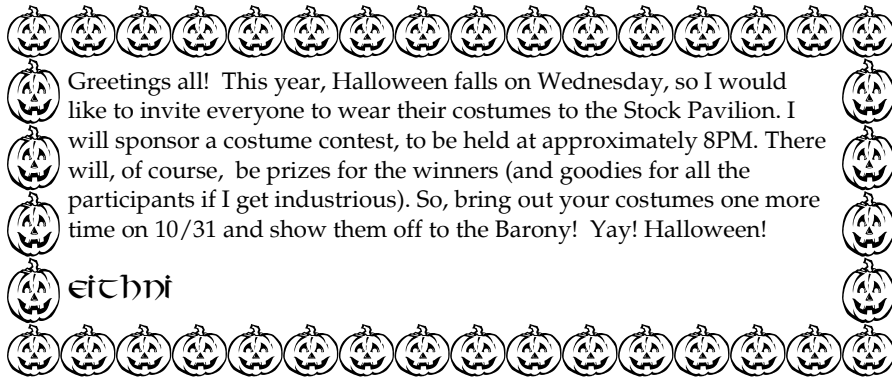
Wulfhomm (Eithni): Ambrose is inventorying their possessions. They would like to donate them to a group that is starting up.

1586: Mary I of Scotland goes on trial for conspiracy against Elizabeth I of England
October 17, 1346: Battle of Neville's Cross: King David II of Scotland is captured by Edward III of England at Calais, and imprisoned in the Tower of London for eleven years
October 18, 1016: Canute I victorious at Ashingdon. After engaging Edmund Ironside in several battles, Canute scored this significant victory, and Edmund agreed to divide England between himself and Canute. At the end of November, however, Edmund died, and Canute became king of all England.
October 21, 1422: Henry VI proclaimed King of France. Already King of England, Henry was proclaimed King of France upon the death of his maternal grandfather, Charles VI. He was ten months old, and would not be officially crowned until 1431.
1492: Christopher Columbus lands on the San Salvador Islands.
October 24, 1260: Saif ad-Din Qutuz, Mamluk sultan of Egypt, is assassinated by Baibars, who seizes power for himself.
1273: Rudolf I Crowned King of Germany.
October 28, 1216: Henry III of England crowned. Henry was the first English monarch to be crowned while still a minor.
1492: Christopher Columbus lands in Cuba.
October 29, 1061: Emperor disposes of Bishop Cadalus & Pope Honorius II
1268: Conradin, the last legitimate male heir of the Hohenstaufen dynasty of Kings of Germany and Holy Roman Emperors, is executed along with his companion Frederick I, Margrave of Baden by Charles I of Sicily, a political rival and ally to the hostile Catholic church.
October 30, 1340: Battle of Río Salado, a victory for King Afonso IV of Portugal and King Alfonso XI of Castile over Muslim ruler Abu al-Hasan 'Ali of Marinid' dynasty and Nasrid ruler Yusuf I. This battle was a final attempt of Marinids to invade the Iberian Peninsula. The Marinids had mobilised a vast army and, after crossing the Strait of Gibraltar and defeating a Christian fleet at Gibraltar, then proceeded inland to the Salado River near Seville, where they met the Christians. The Marinids suffered a disastrous defeat and moved back to Africa.

the ANTI-CALENDAR

(A listing of events that have already happened)

Compiled by Reinholdt von Trollenhagen

- October 2, 1187: Saladin Captures Jerusalem. After 88 years of occupation by the Franks, the Holy City fell to Saladin, who went on to withstand the ensuing Third Crusade.
- October 4, 1582: Pope Gregory XIII implements the Gregorian Calendar. In Italy, Poland, Portugal, and Spain October 4 of this year is followed directly by October 15.
- October 7, 1520: First public burning of books in Netherlands, in Louvain.
- 1542: Explorer Cabrillo discovered Catalina Island off California coast.
- October 9, 1238: James I of Aragon conquered Valencia and founded the Kingdom of Valencia.
- October 10, 732: Battle of Tours: Near Poitiers, France, leader of the Franks Charles Martel and his men, defeat a large army of Moors, stopping the Muslims from spreading into Western Europe. The governor of Cordoba, Abdul Rahman Al Ghafiqi, is killed during the battle.
- 1361: Prince Edward marries Joan Plantagenet. Divorced from her first husband (whom she married in secret at age 12) and widowed when her second husband died in France, Joan, "The Fair Maid of Kent," was not considered the ideal wife for the heir to the English throne. But it appears to have been a successful match. Joan bore Edward two sons, the youngest of whom survived to become Richard II.
- October 12, 1428: Siege of Orléans Begins. The siege of Orléans lasted until Joan of Arc persuaded King Charles VII of France to send an army to relieve the city in April.
- October 13, 1307: Templars Arrested. Rumors of blasphemy and irreligious practices among the knightly order were the grounds on which King Philip IV "the Fair" of France arrested all the Templar Knights. The day was Friday, and folklore has it that this is the reason "Friday the Thirteenth" is considered an unlucky day.
- October 14, 1322: Robert the Bruce of Scotland defeats King Edward II of England at Byland, forcing Edward to accept Scotland's independence

ANNOUNCEMENTS

[Seneschal's note: This is an update on the NCN campground situation. Baroness Marwen sent this post to the Nordskog list, and I thought it spelled out things nicely]

We have some news to share regarding the cancellation of our WW contract with Marv/NCN Campground. Because of the wording of our contract, it is almost certain that there will be additional financial penalties due to Marv for our cancellation from the WW site this year. This matter is being handled by the SCA, Inc. legal resources and the Board of Directors. In this process, there is potential that the Baronies will need to contribute to the financial settlement, as we signed the contract.

We will share more information as it becomes available. In the meantime, everyone can help by NOT discussing this with media, lawyers, non-SCA people, etc. We need to let our legal team do their work.

What can we take away from this in the short term? The contracts we sign *matter*. 99 times out of 100 everything goes great, but when it doesn't, those words on the paper are crucial. Make sure your contracts have fair "out" clauses for both parties, and are an accurate representation of your group's expectations.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Thrown Weapons Marshal — the Thrown Weapons Marshal is responsible for the safe set up and operation of the Barony's thrown weapon practices.
